



Rogue Community College welcomes young students who are ready to take college level classes and are permitted to attend by their high school. To assess your ability to be successful in college classes and to verify that your high school permits you to attend, your next steps are:

1. Make an appointment for a placement test. Call (541) 245-7552 in Medford and (541) 956-7190 in Grants Pass. You may also schedule a placement test online at <http://www.roguecc.edu/PlacementTest>. To be eligible to attend RCC as an underage student you must test into Writing 115, Introduction to Expository Writing **and** Reading 30, College Reading II.
2. Get approval from your high school principal. If you are home schooled, you need verification that you are registered with the Educational Service District (ESD). Call the ESD Home Schooling department at (541) 776-6764 or 1 800 636-7450. Bring either the Principal's release or the ESD verification of home school registration to Rogue Central Services for Students on any campus.
3. Meet with the counselor for underage students for advising and course placement. For an appointment call: Grants Pass - 956-7306; Medford - 245-7552; White City - 245-7863

NOTE:

- High school aged students do not need a principal's release or home school verification to attend night or weekend classes.
- Students are not required to take a placement test for classes that are fewer than three credits.
