Conference "Reframes" Understanding of Learning Disabilities

MEDFORD, Ore.—Jonathan Mooney, a writer and activist, will be the keynote speaker at "The Gift: LD/ADHD Reframed" conference at the Medford Library large meeting room at 205 S. Central, on Thursday, April 23 from 9 a.m. to noon. The conference is free and open to the public.

According to recent data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, about 2.3 million school children have a diagnosed learning disability (LD), and 5.6 million children have been diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). In Oregon, 7 percent of children age 4-17 have ADHD, a 53 percent increase in the last decade.

Yet LD/ADHD is frequently not well understood.

Jonathan Mooney and a panel of RCC students will help conference attendees better relate to the problems and opportunities associated with LD/ADHD, and challenge participants to consider a progressive view of learning and intelligence.

Mooney, because of his learning disabilities and ADHD, did not learn to read until he was 12 years old. Today, he is a graduate of Brown University and holds an honors degree in English Literature. With the publication of *Learning Outside the Lines*, Mooney established himself as one of the foremost leaders in LD/ADHD, disabilities, and alternative education.
