

A report of any crime and any follow-up investigations will be kept on file. A timely report will be made to the campus community on violent crimes of murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, vehicle theft.

Crime prevention

The following options are in place to help prevent crimes from occurring:

Escorts: Facilities personnel are available to provide escorts to parking lots. Use of this service is especially encouraged after dark. Service is limited to availability of staff and is therefore subject to delays.

Lighting: An effort has been made to provide lighting to campus walkways and parking lots.

Emergency phones: Red emergency phones are located on the Redwood Campus in buildings G, I, and J; at the Riverside Campus, G Building; and black phones are in all classrooms at the Higher Education Center. These phones allow the user to call 911 or campus security.

Emergency towers: Three emergency towers are located on the Redwood Campus. The towers have a button that when pushed sends a call directly to 911.

Printed information: The distribution of printed crime information to students and staff enables individuals to be aware of risks and who to contact in the instance of a crime. Emergency contact information is posted in buildings on campus.

Telephones: Public phones are available at some buildings on all three campuses. TTY phones for the hearing impaired are available on the Redwood Campus in the Library and the Student Services Building. On the Riverside Campus, TTY phones are available in the Jackson County Central Library and in Enrollment Services.

Drugs and alcohol

Drugs and alcohol are prohibited at any RCC facility with the exception of legally prescribed medication. Any person under the influence of an intoxicant or controlled substance, or in possession of these, may be removed, dismissed or suspended from RCC premises, functions, classes or activities.

Weapons on campus

The possession of any dangerous weapon on college property is prohibited unless possessed by a certified law enforcement or public safety officer.

Any individual with a dangerous weapon will be escorted off campus and may be subject to disciplinary action and/or arrest.

Harassment

It is the policy of Rogue Community College that all employees and students will be able to work and learn in an environment free from discrimination, including harassment. Therefore, it is a violation of college policy for any employee or student to engage in harassment, including sexual harassment, of any other college employee or student.

Sexual harassment and sexual orientation harassment are forms of discrimination. The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), the federal agency charged with the enforcement of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, has issued guidelines that specifically define sexual harassment as follows:

Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature constitute sexual harassment when —

- Submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly as a term or condition of an individual's employment (or academic success);
- Submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as a basis for employment (or academic) decisions affecting such individuals; or
- Such conduct has the purpose or effect of substantially interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working (or learning) environment (EEOC, 29 CFR CH.XIV).

Harassment complaints should be directed to the RCC Human Rights Network, comprised of college staff, whose members are trained to deal with such allegations.

Should a sex crime occur, Facilities/Security should be notified immediately after the well-being of the victim is established. Local law enforcement will be contacted and guidance provided.

RCC facilities in Josephine County include the Redwood Campus, Business Development Center, the Ester Bristol Education Center, and the Illinois Valley Learning Center.

The Redwood Campus is comprised of 83 acres and 28 buildings. There are two entrances to access campus. The RWC campus has 15 parking lots, 770 parking spaces, and 26 handicapped parking spaces. There also is an enforced campus vehicle parking policy. All Josephine County locations are open from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. and closed from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

RCC facilities in Jackson County include the Riverside Campus and the Table Rock Campus.

The Riverside Campus is comprised of six buildings in downtown Medford: A, B, F, G, H, and HEC. All are typically open from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. on weekdays. RVC is an urban campus surrounded by city streets and city parking lots. Handicapped parking is provided by the City of Medford.

Table Rock Campus in White City is typically open from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. weekdays.

All buildings in Josephine and Jackson counties have a facilities key card system. Entry to locked buildings is only by key card access. Some buildings are equipped with building alarms, door alarms, and fire sprinkler systems.

CAMPUS SECURITY AND SAFETY

At Rogue Community College, security and safety needs are dealt with in cooperation with several agencies. For criminal activity RCC relies on the Grants Pass and Medford City Police and the Josephine or Jackson County Sheriff's departments, and for fire safety, the Grants Pass and Medford City Fire Departments, Jackson County RFD #3, and Valley Fire Department.
