# Rogue Community College District Board of Education – January 29, 2016 Special Meeting (Telephonic) Minutes

- 1. Call to Order The Special Board meeting of the Rogue Community College (RCC) Board of Education (Board) was called to order by Kevin Talbert at approximately 2:00 p.m., Friday, January 29, 2016 via teleconference at (541) 956-7422. The teleconference call was initiated from the RCC Redwood Campus, 3345 Redwood Hwy, Grants Pass OR 97527. Due notice was given.
- **2. Determine Presence of Quorum** A quorum of the Board was present including Pat Ashley, Ron Fox, Claudia Sullivan, Kevin Talbert, and Dean Wendle.
  - Board member(s) absent: Brett Johnson and Tim Johnson
- 3. Guests and Public Comment DonnaJean Wendle, community member, and Zachary Malatesta, President, Riverside Campus (RVC) and Table Rock Campus (TRC) Associated Student Government (ASG), and RCC District employees Peter Angstadt, Kori Ebenhack-Bieber, Kirk Gibson, Lisa Stanton and Denise Nelson joined the conference call.

### 4. Board Action Item

A. Approval of May 17, 2016 Bond Campaign Projects and Amounts

President Angstadt reviewed the proposed summary of May 2016 bond project descriptions (see file – exhibit A). He also reviewed the detailed 2016 project descriptions as of January 22 (see file – exhibit B).

Proposed projects and amounts include:

- Redwood Campus Nursing Building Expansion \$1 million
- Redwood Campus Elk Building (Science) Remodel \$5 million
- LaunchHouse Entrepreneurial Center Project \$2 million
- Emergency Services/Fire Training Facility Classrooms \$500,000
- High Tech Center \$2 million
- Career and Technical Education Expansion \$1.5 million
- Health Professions Training Center \$8 million

Board members discussed the details of the proposed topics. President Angstadt explained we would receive specific details when architect and engineering information is submitted at a later date.

Discussion occurred regarding renaming the LaunchHouse project and Board members reached consensus on doing so. A suggestion was received to rename the project "Facilities Improvements to Support Small Business, Art and Technical Education."

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President Angstadt reported the \$20 million bond campaign, at roughly 5 cents per thousand, would be proportionally based on the student population of 60% Jackson County and 40% Josephine County.

#### MAIN MOTION

Dean Wendle moved, seconded by Claudia Sullivan, the Board approve Exhibit A, Summary of May 2016 Bond Project Descriptions, (see file) for the \$20 million, RCC District, May 17, 2016, bond election to include the <u>renaming</u> of the project listed as item C, LaunchHouse Entrepreneurial Center.

**B.** Approval of Intent to Reimburse Expenditures from Proceeds of Tax-Exempt Obligations

President Angstadt reported if the May 2016 bond passes, the approval of intent to reimbursement expenditures from proceeds of tax-exempt obligations will allow reimbursement to the College on expenses from the High Tech Center.

Dean Wendle moved, seconded by Pat Ashley, the Board adopt Resolution No. B43-15/16, declaring intent to reimburse expenditures from proceeds of tax-exempt obligations.

#### The motion unanimously carried.

**5. Old Business** – Peter recommended canceling the February 16 special Board meetings scheduled for 12:00 p.m. and 1:15 p.m. due to work load with the presidential search. Board members agreed.

Peter reported Judy Basker, Executive Director, RCC Foundation, has received \$30,000 to date for the bond campaign and another \$30,000 pledge. He reported Zachary Malatesta has volunteered to serve as the student chair.

- 6. New Business Claudia Sullivan congratulated Ron Fox on his work with the Southern Oregon Business Conference, she commented it was a very good conference. Dean Wendle and Pat Ashley agreed.
