

Your eligibility for Federal Student Aid as an eligible noncitizen is under review by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). DHS will continue to check its records and notify RCC once more information is available. To review eligible status categories, including details about document expiration dates, visit the studentaid.gov website.

If you can provide one of the following documents, we may be able to begin reviewing your FAFSA sooner. Eligible statuses may include but are not limited to the following:

- U.S Permanent Resident with a Form I-551 or I-151 (Permanent Resident Card, Resident Alien Card, or Alien Registration Receipt Card), also known as a “green card”
- You have an Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from the U.S. Citizen and Immigration Services (USCIS) showing one of the following status categories:
 - Refugee
 - Asylum Granted
 - Conditional Resident Alien
 - Cuban-Haitian Entrant
- You hold a T nonimmigrant status (“T-visa” for victims of human trafficking) or your parent holds a T-1 nonimmigrant status

You are not an eligible noncitizen and cannot receive federal student aid if you:

- Have only a “Notice of Approval to Apply for Permanent Residence” (I-171 or I-464)
- Are in the U.S. on an F-1, F-2, or M-1 nonimmigrant student visa, or on a J-1 or J-2 nonimmigrant Exchange Visitor Visa
- Hold a G series visa (pertaining to international organizations)

If you have one of the eligible status documents, please contact Financial Aid Advising ([contact information here](#)). If you do NOT have one of these items, we are required to wait for an update from DHS.
