MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

1. **AGE:** Must be at least eighteen (18) years of age or older. Provide nonreturnable proof.
2. **EDUCATION:** High school diploma or GED certificate. Applicants must furnish a copy of their high school diploma or GED certificate as nonreturnable proof.
3. **MATH:** Must have completed one full year of high school algebra with a passing grade of "C" or better, or one post-high school algebra course (equivalent to one full year of high school algebra) with a passing grade of "C" or better. Provide nonreturnable proof/transcript.

All required documentation demonstrating that minimum qualifications have been met must be submitted online.

Applications that do not meet the minimum qualifications, or whose submitted documentation does not satisfy the required criteria, will not be considered for an interview. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that all materials are complete and meet all stated requirements prior to submission.

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA: The standards apply to the geographical area of Jackson and Josephine Counties in the state of Oregon.

Applicants who meet all minimum qualifications will be interviewed by the JATC.
Interviews are conducted **every three to six months.**

Apprentices will be selected based on their final ranking as job openings become available.

Your Right to Equal Opportunity.

1. It is against the law for a Sponsor of an apprenticeship program registered for Federal purposes to discriminate against an apprenticeship applicant or apprentice based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, age (18 years or older), genetic information, or disability. The Sponsor must ensure equal opportunity with regard to all terms, conditions, and privileges associated with apprenticeship. If you think that you have been subjected to discrimination, you may file a complaint within 300 days from the date of the alleged discrimination or failure to follow the equal opportunity standards with Oregon Bureau of Labor and Industries, 800 NE Oregon Street, Suite 1045, Portland, OR 97232. You may also be able to file complaints directly with the EEOC, or State fair employment practices agency at the above location
2. Each complaint filed must be made in writing and include the following information: (a) Complainant's name, address and telephone number, or other means for contacting the complainant; (b) The identity of the respondent (i.e. the name, address, and telephone number of the individual or entity that the complainant alleges is responsible for the discrimination); (c) A short description of the events that the complainant believes were discriminatory, including but not limited to when the events took place, what occurred, and why the complainant believes the actions were discriminatory (for example, because of his/her race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, age (18 or older), genetic information, or disability); (d) The complainant's signature or the signature of the complainant's authorized representative.

Veterans eligible for GI Bill benefits may use them in this program.
