Behind-the-Wheel Expectations: Students must bring a valid driving permit to all behind-the-wheel sessions. A student will not be allowed to drive and will be considered absent if his/her permit is not available. Students must wear appropriate clothing and shoes to class. No sandals, flip-flops, or heals are allowed in the car. Extremely long fingernails that prevent a student from firmly gipping the steering wheel are not allowed. We suggest students wear comfortable, securely fitted shoes. Appropriate corrective lenses are required, and sunglasses are highly recommended. Please review your calendar to ensure there are no conflicts with drive times. If a student has a conflict with the arranged drive time, the student must contact the behind the wheel instructor. This needs to be done no later than the night before the drive, since the instructor may have several drives each day and cannot be reached on short notice. If an instructor has a conflict with a Behind-the-Wheel session, the instructor will contact the student(s) involved. DRIVER EDUCATION VEHICLES WILL NOT WAIT MORE THAN 5 MINUTES PAST THE APPOINTED TIME FOR TARDY STUDENTS. If a student misses the car, he/she will be considered absent. If the student has missed a behind-the-wheel session (not pre-excused), a \$50 missed drive fee will be added to their student

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Guided practice behind the wheel is essential for habit development to occur. Oregon Administrative Rule 737-015-0030 5(d) requires that you provide a minimum of 5 hours of supervised home practice for your
teen prior to the completion of this course. It further requires that practice be documented, in the form of a log or other means, demonstrating to the provider that the requirement has been met. You must submit your practice record prior to receiving a certificate of completion.
The Department of Motor Vehicles requires new teen drivers who complete a driver education course to
have at least 50 hours of supervised practice before they are eligible to apply for a Provisional License. The
Oregon Parent Guide to Teen Driving includes a driving log to keep track of the time you spend practicing. It also contains information and tips you'll find helpful as you guide your teen through this program.
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Driver Education Completion for ages 15-17 will be in the DMV system 10 business days after the
student passes the final drive assessment. An RCC certificates of completion for insurance purposes will
be emailed out after students have passed the final drive assessment. *Please note that students 18-21
will only receive an RCC Certificate of Completion; they must take their license test with the DMV.
