#### **Updates:**

-Enrollments: Up in CTE and down in Transfer/GE, but overall still up. Almost all CTE depts are up in enrollment.

-ERP update: Intent to Award has been given to Jenzabar (<u>https://jenzabar.com/</u>). Now we're in the appeal period. Next is contract negotiation, and then it will be official or not.
