


Next Meeting: March 6th!

SOUTHERN OREGON OPEN EDUCATION SUMMIT ...and more from the desk of Tina Weyland, Library Services



Join your Southern Oregon peers April 24th at the **Southern Oregon Open Education Summit!** Sponsored by Open Oregon, this one-day conference on OERs and open pedagogy will include faculty, staff, administrators, and students from Rogue, Klamath, and Umpqua Community Colleges, Southern Oregon University, and Oregon Institute of Technology.

Keynote speaker Monica Brown (Boise State University) will discuss the power of open resources and open pedagogy to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion in higher education. OERs are an important promoter of equity, and open pedagogy, with its commitment to honoring students' role in their own learning, offers compelling opportunities to make instruction more inclusive. Other sessions will cover locating relevant open content, advocacy for affordable course materials, and emerging zero-textbook-cost degree pathways.

Registration is free. Breakfast and lunch will be provided, and RCC employees will be reimbursed for travel. Adjunct faculty are eligible for a \$150 stipend for attendance. Contact librarians Felishia Jenkins or Tina Weyland with any questions.
