New Student Orientation (NSO)

You must complete the NSO before you begin classes. The NSO is designed to give you tools for success at RCC including information about RCC, paying for classes, and student support services.

Degrees, certificates and programs

Associate degrees

- Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer (AAOT) — For students planning to complete an associate's degree before transferring into a baccalaureate program at an Oregon public university.
- Associate of Applied Science (AAS) — Students can earn a degree in a two-year career and technical program.
- Associate of General Studies (AGS) — Allows students to complete a degree tailored to the general education and academic major requirements of a transfer college or university.
- Associate of Science (AS) — For students transferring to a four-year degree program in applied studies.
- Associate of Science/Oregon Transfer–Business — Allows business majors to fulfill general education requirements for transfer to an Oregon public university.
- Associate of Science/Oregon Transfer–Computer Science — Allows computer science majors to fulfill general education requirements for transfer to an Oregon public university.

Certificates

Career Pathways, less than one-year, and one- and two-year certificate of completion programs prepare students for entry-level jobs in a variety of occupations.
