

## **Practical Nursing Practicum Fee Proposal**

Rogue Community College offers a limited-entry, three-term program leading to a certificate in Practical Nursing (PN), which meets the educational requirements for the national exam for PN licensure (NCLEX-PN).

Practical nurses provide individualized care in a variety of health care settings such as long-term care, hospitals, home health, doctor's offices and other community settings. Licensed practical nurses (LPNs) care for the sick, injured, convalescent, and disabled under the direction of a registered nurse, nurse practitioner, licensed physician, dentist, or other independent health care provider recognized by the State Board of Nursing. Licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses must complete a state-approved educational program, which typically takes about 1 year to complete. The average salary is \$47,880 per year according to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics

According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses is projected to grow 9 percent from 2019 to 2029, much faster than the average for all occupations. As the baby-boomer population ages, the overall need for healthcare services is expected to increase. LPNs and LVNs will be needed in residential care facilities and in-home health environments to care for older patients.

In 2019/20 this program received 57 student applications for admittance, with 51 applicants qualifying for the program. The program admitted 24 of the qualified applicants.

The college is proposing additional program-specific fees of \$500 a term for a total of \$1,500 for those enrolled in the program. This fee will be in addition to standard tuition and fees charged to students admitted into the program after winter 2021.
